

## What Group Leaders Need to Know

CGC is a highly utilized club with 600 members (plus their guests) who also want to shoot on our 20 shooting ranges spread over 115 acres. For your outing to succeed, you need to share detailed information with the CGC Youth Shooting Coordinator early on so that the venues you want can be reserved. Please allow 45 days advance notice for each reservation.

### To make a confirmed reservation you need to share...

- É Complete contact information for the group leader or trip planner (email and cell phone)
- É Goals your group hopes to achieve
- É An approximate number of shooters and adult leaders
- É Number and types of guns
- É Some sort of proposed schedule
- É A proposed start time and end time
- É Your lunch plans

### Example

ö We have 12 youth shooters and 3 adult leaders who want to shoot in April. The purpose is to finish some BSA Rifle Merit Badges using .22 rifles in the morning session, and have a öfun shootö with shotguns on a Trap course after lunch. We'll arrive at 10AM and plan to be done by 5PM. We'll bring our own lunch.ö

### Things to consider

- É You'll be shooting as a single group all day. Where the CGC Youth Shooting Coordinator goes, the whole group goes. Bring enough adult leadership. Hiking and öexploringö are not permitted.
- É Time is precious. Remember that in spring and summer, even with a reservation, you may have to wait for your "reserved" range. Allow 30 minutes for the required paperwork and a safety briefing.
- É You may only load 1 cartridge at a time while shooting at CGC. Bringing a .22 rifle that loads through the butt stock may be more aggravation than its worth.
- É We have no food on the premises. Not even a drink machine. However, we do have nice picnic pavilions, potable running water, electricity, and porta-potties.
- É Remember person hygiene. Bring drinking cups, toilet paper and hand soap.
- É We do not supply BSA or 4H paperwork. If signatures are needed, then we are glad to sign your paperwork.
- É This is a Youth program for Youth Shooters. Adults may only shoot to instruct or demonstrate.

### What you need to bring

- É Youth who have completed a safety course and are familiar with the guns they intend to shoot
- É Guns, cleaned and inspected to be in good working order
- É Your own ammo and paper targets
- É Eye and ear protection for [each person](#) (not just the shooters)
- É CGC Medical Waiver (or its equivalent) for [each person under 18](#), signed by the parent(s)
- É CGC Legal Release for [each person](#). Signed by parent(s) for those under 18, or by the visitor for those over 18
- É Adults may want to bring a comfy folding chair
- É 2 checks or cash. We do not have a cashier or an ATM.
